Talk with church family: Zacchaeus

Bible reading: Luke 19: 1-10 Jesus and Zacchaeus

He entered Jericho and was passing through it. 2 A man was there named Zacchaeus; he was a chief tax collector and was rich. 3 He was trying to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was short in stature. 4 So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to see him, because he was going to pass that way. 5 When Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today." 6 So he hurried down and was happy to welcome him. 7 All who saw it began to grumble and said, "He has gone to be the guest of one who is a sinner." 8 Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Look, half of my possessions, Lord, I will give to the poor; and if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I will pay back four times as much." 9 Then Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, because he too is a son of Abraham. 10 For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost."

Hymn:

Perched high, exposed and ridiculed, an awkward little man, the tax collector hung on tight; he had no other plan.
But Jesus knew his tree, and sought to set him free, "Zacchaeus, I must eat with you, get down because you can!"

A guest within a sinner's house – thought shocking, out of place – our Jesus loudly criticised, would not admit disgrace; he'd come to help the lost, regardless of the cost, so joy to see Zacchaus saved, shone bright on Jesus' face.

No matter our predicament – Exposed, absurd or wrong – the one who helped Zacchaeus down, for us, still comes along; with welcome, hope and joy, each self-trap to destroy, to set us free, new selves to be, and let us share his song!

The Lord's Prayer

Bible readings: Habakkuk 1: 1-4; 2:1-5a

- 1 The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw.
- 2 O Lord, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen?

Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save?

3 Why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble?

Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise.

4 So the law becomes slack, and justice never prevails.

The wicked surround the righteous; therefore judgment comes forth perverted.

I will stand at my watchpost and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what he will say to me and what he[c] will answer concerning my complaint.

2 Then the Lord answered me and said:

Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it.

- 3 For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end and does not lie.
- If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come; it will not delay.
- 4 Look at the proud! Their spirit is not right in them, but the righteous live by their faithfulness.
- 5 Moreover, wealth[d] is treacherous; the arrogant do not endure.
- They open their throats wide as Sheol; like Death they never have enough.

2 Thessalonians 1: 1-12

Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy, to the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. We must always give thanks to God for you, brothers and sisters, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of everyone of you for one another is increasing. Therefore we ourselves boast of you among the churches of God for your steadfastness and faith during all your persecutions and the afflictions that you are enduring.

This is evidence of the righteous judgment of God, and is intended to make you worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are also suffering. For it is indeed just of God to

repay with affliction those who afflict you, and to give relief to the afflicted as well as to us, when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels in flaming fire, inflicting vengeance on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. These will suffer the punishment of eternal destruction, separated from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his might, when he comes to be glorified by his saints and to be marvelled at on that day among all who have believed, because our testimony to you was believed. To this end we always pray for you, asking that our God will make you worthy of his call and will fulfill by his power every good resolve and work of faith, so that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.
